The “Way Far Outs”, a group she quilts with weekly, save their scraps for her. Recently she has begun to use mostly batiks, but no good fabric is turned away. She tends to piece by machine and quilts by hand. You will also see applique and red work (not always red, of course) on some quilts. Her favorite technique is piecing.

She makes the quilt top, layers it, pins the layers together, binds the quilt and then hand quilts it.
